WHO IT'S FOR & CORE UNITS

The creative industries are a significant contributor to Australia’s economy, adding nearly \$45.89 billion annually to the GDP. Employment in this sector is expected to continue growing, driven by innovation and the increasing demand for creative content. The Australian creative economy contributed approximately 6.4% of Gross Domestic Product and accounted for around 5.5% of total employment, according to Creative Australia and the Australia Council for the Arts reports.

This qualification supports teaching professionals to build recognised higher education capability that can strengthen employability, support progression into education leadership roles, and open access to higher remuneration opportunities over time.

- Creative educators (part-time/full-time) seeking formal credentials
- Industry and creative arts professionals from areas such as music, design, fashion, media, performing arts seeking to move into teaching roles
- Learning support staff moving into teaching
- Academic leaders aiming to upskill or support their teams
